But Mushtadidn't go to Seattle's Swedish Medical Center to prepare for the birth of her first child. She's there because she's about to become a grandmother and her daughter wanted todisabuse her of many outdated notions about raising kids. "It kind of took me aback," Mushta, 64, a retired executive assistant, says ofbeing asked to attend a grandparenting class. But she agreed to go, she says aftersetting aside her clumsily wrapped baby doll, because "I wanted my daughter to feelcomfortable that I would do things her way. " In the long, often passive-aggressive history of generational conflict over childrearing, there have been gentle reminders, willful ignorance, more emphatic reminders, stealthily supervised visits and, in the most extreme cases, unaccepted offers tobabysit. But the rise of grandparenting classes represents a marked shift amongparents from attempting to lecture their forebears to hiring experts to do the lecturingfor them. Revenue-hungry hospitals, particularly in larger cities, are eager to take onthis role. Swedish Medical, which increased the frequency of its grandparenting classes from every other month to twice a month; offers a three-hour grandparenting classas part of its \$ 275 Welcome Baby package, which includes seminars on consciousfathering, sibling preparation, coping with confidence and other topics guaranteed tomake mothers-in-law roll their eyes. Family harmony is the ultimate goal, but much of grandparenting classes dealwith down-in-the-trenches details like how to change a diaper and when to introducecereals. But perhaps the biggest source of generational friction is over how to put ababy to bed.
