前言

普通中国读者,包括英语专业的学生,对于英国文学的了解一般只限于个别经典作品,而对作家 其人其事及其整个文学创作情况所知甚少。

其中部分的原因是文学史家们编写的英国文学史往往注重介绍作品的情节内容,对作家的生活经历、 作品的具体创作过程着墨不多。

上海外语教育出版社从英国大英图书馆出版社(The British Librarv)引进出版"英国作家生平丛书", 弥补了这方面的缺憾。

该丛书以图文并茂的形式讲述莎士比亚等14位英国著名作家的生平故事,同时穿插介绍他们的作品,有助于充实读者对英国文学的认识。

英国文学源远流长,经历了长期复杂的发展演变过程。

在这个过程中,文学本体以外的各种现实的、历史的、政治的、文化的力量对文学发生着影响,而作家个体的独特生活遭遇也是造就文学杰作的一个重要因素。

"英国作家生平丛书"对14位名家的传记式介绍,充分展示了这一点。

"英国作家生平丛书"原版由大英图书馆出版社出版,体现出图书馆出版物的特点。

书中配有大量的插图,有些是珍贵的手稿,有些是罕见的照片,有些是博物馆或美术馆珍藏的油画和 素描,让读者有幸一睹作家的风采,产生直观的感觉。
