前言

普通中国读者,包括英语专业的学生,对于英国文学的了解一般只限于个别经典作品,而对作家 其人其事及其整个文学创作情况所知甚少。

其中部分的原因是文学史家们编写的英国文学史往往注重介绍作品的情节内容,对作家的生活经历、 作品的具体创作过程着墨不多。

上海外语教育出版社从英国大英图书馆出版社(The British Library)引进出版"英国作家生平丛书", 弥补了这方面的缺憾。

该丛书以图文并茂的形式讲述莎士比亚等14位英国著名作家的生平故事,同时穿插介绍他们的作品,有助于充实读者对英国文学的认识。

英国文学源远流长,经历了长期复杂的发展演变过程。

Through Reynolds Keats met James Rice, a young lawyer who, thoughincurably ill, had a warm humour and a philosophical outlook that made himparticularly lovable - the most sensible, and even wise Man I know, Keats said. Also through Reynolds he met Benjamin Bailey, an Oxford undergraduate studyingfor ordination. Bailey shared Keatss love of literature, and the two men quicklybecame friends. Towards the end of the summer Bailey invited Keats to spend thesecond half of the vacation with him in Oxford. Keats, whose brothers had just leftfor France to enjoy a holiday at his expense, immediately accepted. He arrived at Oxford at the beginning of September. Bailey lived atMagdalen Hall, and his rooms had a fine view overlooking the deer park. Keatstook to the ancient university town at once; This Oxford I have no doubt is thefinest City in the world, he wrote to his sister Fanny, it is full of old Gothicbuildings - Spires - towers - Quadrangles - Cloisters Groves &c and is surrounded with more Clear streams than ever I saw together.

编辑推荐

John Keats died at a tragically early age , but during his short life he contrib-uted what have become some of the best-known poems in the Englishlanguage , such as Ode to a Nightingale , Ode on a Grecian Urn and ToAutumn. In this new biography of Keats , Stephen Hebron traces Keatss life and devel-opment as a poet , assessing his work in the context of the contemporary social and literary scene. After leaving school Keats worked as an apprentice to anapothecary , and then went on to train as a surgeon. But it was poetry that dominated his life. He began to ~ve in poetic and artistic circles , countingamong his friends and acqua! nnces Leigh Hunt. Benjamin Robert Haydon. Charles Lamb and Percy Bysshe Shelley and it was not long before his poetywas published regularly. Despite admiration of him by contemporary literary figures , reviewers were not as favourable and in his lifetime the majority of hispoetry met with harsh criticism. Having lost his mother and brother to tuberculosis , Keats knew the signs of the illness when he too succumbed. Sent to Italy by his doctor to recuperate , he never returned , dying in Rome aged just 25. His poetry inspired Tennysonand Browning , and the Pre-Raphaelitepainters ranked him on a par with Dante , Homer , Chaucer and Goethe. Today , Keatsis recognised as one of the great poets of the Romantic. or indeed any age , confir-mation of his own sure assertion : I think Ishall be among the English Poets after mydeath.
