《明达语言维度观及其哲学关照》在哲学和语言学对明达语言研究的基础上提出了明达语言维度观，认为明达语言是语言、言语和心智的一个不可分的维度。

在论证明达语言维度观的同时，作者讨论了两个重要的哲学论题：语言与心智（mind）的关系；语言的不完备性。

最后，作者用自己提出的明达语言维度观来考察另一个重要的语言哲学论题：语言和实在的关系。

《明达语言维度观及其哲学关照》理论价值和哲学意义在于提出并论证了明达语言维度观，并对三个重要的语言哲学论题——语言与心智的关系、语言与实在的关系、语言的不完备性——提出了自己新的理论和分析视角。
